We are part of Island Creek Community (ICC)

ICC is a group of volunteers that support local Girl Scout members in the Katy area by providing fun, local events your troop can attend! ICC also hosts monthly meetings and trainings for adult volunteers (called Summits and Cafés) where troop members can network and share ideas! Our community also has a Mentor Program to help new troops be successful! A seasoned Troop Mentor will be assigned to every new Troop Leader. A special "Mock Meeting" training will be held for new leaders to cover planning troop meetings, Leader tips & tricks, example crafts and how to do opening/closing ceremonies!

A Girl Scout Troop is a group of girls building Courage, Confidence and Character and adult volunteers that support them! ICC will help place girls in your troop from the surrounding schools in your area.

A Troop is made up of at least 5 girls and the following Adult Volunteers:

- ✓ At least 2 unrelated Leaders
- ✓ A Troop Treasurer
- ✓ First Aider
- ✓ Product Sales Manager
- ✓ Cookie Sales Manager
- ✓ Friends and Family Helpers with CBC

Girls from the same grade level have registered for Girl Scouts and are ready to start a troop! Now, to make this troop a reality, we need parents to step up and accept leadership positions.



Your Troop will need...

- \square At least $\underline{\mathsf{TWO}}$ unrelated Leaders (who do not live in the same household):
 - > To be a Leader you must complete the online training, be in good standing with GSSJC and pass a comprehensive criminal background check.
 - **Leaders Responsibilities:**
 - Open a Troop bank account & maintain all Troop paper work and forms
 - Secure a meeting location & determine frequency of meetings
 - Stay current with GSSJC and GSUSA program materials, resources, policies and procedures through training, meetings, Troop Scoop, and GSSJC/GSUSA websites
 - Facilitate meetings, events, badge work and journeys to be girl led
 - Support and empower girls to reach their full potential

A Troop Treasurer:

- > A Troop Treasurer works with the Troop Leaders to maintain and balance Troop Finances
- ➤ The Treasurer will need to open a bank account with a Troop Leader and submit bank registration F-36 form to Community Specialist within 5 days of opening account
- > Save all receipts from Troop purchases
- > Turn in your Troop Financial Report in May to the Island Creek Community Financial Specialist

Product Sales Programs: Earn Money for your Troop!


- > Troop Cookie Manager and Fall Product Manager:
 - To participate in either Product Sales program, Your Troop will need an adult volunteer to be your Sales Manager and coordinate all Troop Sales
 - To be a Product Sales Manager, you must be a registered Girl Scout, pass a Criminal Background Check, be in good standing with GSSJC, and attend training.
 - Fall Product Sales are from September to November
 - Cookie Sales are from January to March
 - When your Troop participates in product sales, your Girl Scouts are empowered by learning leadership skills, money management, sales and marketing! It also Earns Troop Funds to pay for Troop Activities and Fieldtrips!!!

Thank you for saying YES and stepping up to make this troop a reality! Your generous commitment gives your troop the opportunity to discover new skills, challenge themselves, connect with others and make a difference in their community and the WORLD! How to become a LEADER...

Step #1 - Adult Girl Scout Membership

Go to www.gssjc.org and create a MyGS account. You then need to sign up for a Girl Scout Membership at https://girlscouts.secure.force.com and pay the \$25 membership fee. Please note, you MUST select "Leader" as your troop role when registering. GSSJC will also run a criminal background check on all leaders and many key adult roles.

Step #2 - Troop Leader Training

Now it's time to take your Troop Leader training! This can be completed online! Once your training is complete and your background check clears (you'll receive a postcard when complete), GSSJC will send you an official Appointment Letter with all of your troop information. That letter will authorize you to open a Troop Bank Account!

Step #3 - Troop Bank Account

You must have at least 2 unrelated Adults on your bank account. It is highly recommended that these individuals be a Troop Leader and the Troop Treasurer.

Step #4 - Get First Aid Certified

While not required, we highly recommend that at least one Troop Volunteer be CPR/First Aid Certified. Check the ICC Facebook Page to find local opportunities to get certified!

RUNNING YOUR TROOP



Find a Meeting Location:

A Church, Community Club House, School or a Leader's House are a few possibilities!

Your First Meeting:

- Come to Island Creek's Mock Meeting Training on September 9th and learn how to manage and run a successful meeting before leading one of your own!
- ❖ It's Highly Recommended to have a Parent Meeting to start things off right! You will need to collect a <u>Medical Form</u> (with a shot record and copy of the front and back of the parent's Medical Insurance Card) for each girl and an <u>Adult Emergency</u> <u>Form</u> for each adult that is a legal guardian.
- It's also a great time to go over what Girl Scouts is all about with your parents!
- ❖ If you already have your Troop Calendar prepared, you can discuss it and let your parents know what your expectations are for them and the Troop.
- ❖ It's also recommended to have Parents sign up to bring Snacks and Drinks to meetings! Just pass around a sign up sheet! Don't forget to list any food allergies that apply to your Troop.
- **Ask for additional volunteers if your Troop still has open positions!**

TROOP FINANCES



You are in Community #27 "Island Creek" & Region #9 "Katy"

There are several things you need to know about Troop Finances!

- 1. Bank Account Basics (See training video for more info):
 - ❖ Bank Accounts MUST be registered with GSSJC and styled as "GSSJC Troop #123456789" (but use your actual Troop Number)
 - ❖ See Form F-34 for the procedure on how to open your bank account
 - ❖ After your Troop Bank Account is opened, you will need to complete Form F-36 and Return it to our Community Financial Specialist, Bernadette Bressler within 5 days! Contact at: islandcreek.financials@gmail.com
 - ❖ You can open your Troop Account at the Bank of your choice but remember the following:
 - You want to select a bank with NO fees for Troop Accounts
 - Most banks require 2 forms of identification, Drivers License and Social Security card are preferred
 - The whole process takes about 45+ minutes
 - When you open an account you will likely have to deposit around \$200. Check with your bank for exact amount required.
 - If you have trouble you can contact Bernadette Bressler for a list of suggested banks. One such bank is Prosperity Bank (99

2. Troop Dues

❖ To help keep track of your Troop Dues, you can use Form F-01

3. Troop Annual Financial Report

- ❖ Every Troop is responsible for turning in a Troop Financial Report, F-31 every year.
- This Report is due to the Community Financial Specialist, along with a copy of your April ending Bank Statement, in May
